Top 3 CanSkate Tips

- 1. Dress Warmly—Skaters should wear warm clothes that let them move easily. Don't forget mittens or gloves and a CSA-approved hockey helmet (bike helmets are not allowed). Name tags must be worn on every session—return them at the end of the season
- 2. Good Skates Make a Big Difference—Skates should fit snugly around the ankle and be sharpened. Avoid plastic or adjustable skates they are hard to balance in. Make sure they are tied tightly.
- 3. Celebrate Progress and keep it fun!—Each new skill, ribbon, or badge is exciting! Cheer for your skater encouragement helps them stay motivated. The goal is to enjoy skating. Smiles and effort matter more than perfection!
